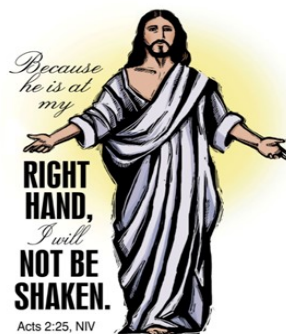

**Our Sunday Visitor Question of the Week.** In John's Gospel, what phrases or words or images catch your ear? What promise of Christ do you hear most clearly? Jesus is "the way, the truth, the life" and he asks us to do as he does. What are some ways that you can act like Jesus would if he were in your situation? How are the promises of this Gospel passage made real in your own life? How do you experience yourself doing greater works than even Jesus did?

**Please pray:** for one another, for ALL who are waiting to encounter our Risen Lord in the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Communion and Matrimony. Pray for the grace of Ordination to empower the pastors and servants of the faithful as they lead us through these turbulent times. Take advantage of Christ's healing presence in the grace of the Sacrament of Reconciliation and if gravely ill the Anointing of the Sick. God is with us! That is His Promise and God is faithful. Jesus, we trust in you.

**A tale of two Moms, the Eucharist, & the word AND.** The "Moms" are my Grandmother, Mary Magdalene from 'Lika' in Croatia; and Mother, Rose from Pueblo. Grandma Mary died when I was very young. I only remember her speaking two or three words of English – but she taught volumes about her relationship with God and love through family rituals, signs and symbols – including the actions of her life.

Mama Rose – was a woman of words – who mused that she struggled mightily to shut up so someone else could occasionally have the last word. She shared our Catholic faith as a catechist with generations of children at St. Therese – but like so many Mothers was disheartened by what she perceived as her failure to ignite a love of the Catholic faith in her grandchildren and great grandchildren. She also taught through her actions.

Grandma Mary never went to Mass – not even on Christmas and Easter. She couldn't understand the language spoken but zealously lived her Catholic faith at home and sent her children to Catechism and Mass. When asked by an impudent granddaughter (me, Marge) why she didn't go to Mass to receive Communion she explained through my interpreting Mom that she only needed to receive our Lord once in Holy Communion. For her, that one experience of Sacramental union was enough for her lifetime.

Mama Rose, went to Mass and received Communion weekly. Additionally, she spent an hour in prayer and adoration before the Blessed Sacrament (Eucharistic Adoration) every Tuesday for over 50 years!

Grandma's experience of Christ Present in the Eucharist was of an ecstatic union – which would last her a lifetime. Mom's experience was a union equally deep that would not permit a lapse in physical expression. Which brings us to the word AND. As their daughter and granddaughter, the truths of their experiences have found a home in my heart. I am blessed that in this time when I cannot physically receive Holy Communion each week I can lean into the testimony of Grandma Mary Magdalene and trust that Jesus is truly with me in my hunger. AND with Mama Rose, I sit or kneel, in adoration and love AND wait for the day I can physically touch and be nourished by the Bread of Life, the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. May our shared waiting soon come to an end and our hunger soon be satisfied.
