Anointing of the Sick: Call the Parish Office in the event of illness or anticipated hospitalization.

Hospital Visitation: Due to Federal Regulations, our hospitals can no longer supply names or other information about patients. **FYI: As of May 16**, the Cathedral will open for a gathered Mass. We do have a few guidelines that we are needing to follow so please be patient with us as we move forward. Guidelines are as follows:

- Mass will be offered at 4 pm Saturday, 8:30 & 11:30 am Sunday and weekdays (Tuesday-Friday) at 12N with minimal seating. We ask that you call the week of the Mass you are planning on attending.
- Please remain home if you are feeling ill or susceptible to the virus. Mass will continue to be livestreamed at 11:30 am every Sunday.
- We ask that you arrive 15 minutes prior to the Mass time you've signed up for to check in.
- Masks are required at all times. Please bring your own mask.
- Please be considerate of others & only plan to attend 1 mass per week.

We will continue with private prayer M-F but the times will change. The times are:

Monday– 8-9 am; 12-1 pm & 5-6pm

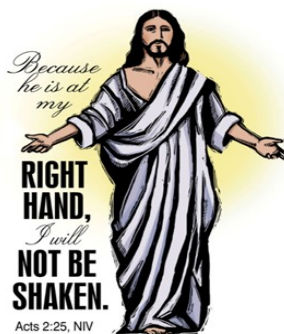
Tues-Friday– 8-9 am & 5-6pm

**OSV Question of the Week**, Sixth Sunday of Easter. When you reread or listen to today’s Gospel, what words or phrases in today’s reading touch your heart and mind? What feeling do you have after hearing the promises of Jesus? Jesus promises to be our friend forever. How do friends treat each other? Jesus promised us that the Holy Spirit (the Advocate) would remain with us always. When have you experienced the Spirit? Which one of the promises in today’s Gospel gives you the most hope?

**Please pray:** for one another, for ALL who are waiting to encounter our Risen Lord in the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Communion and Matrimony. Pray for the grace of Ordination to empower the pastors and servants of the faithful as they lead us through these turbulent times.
