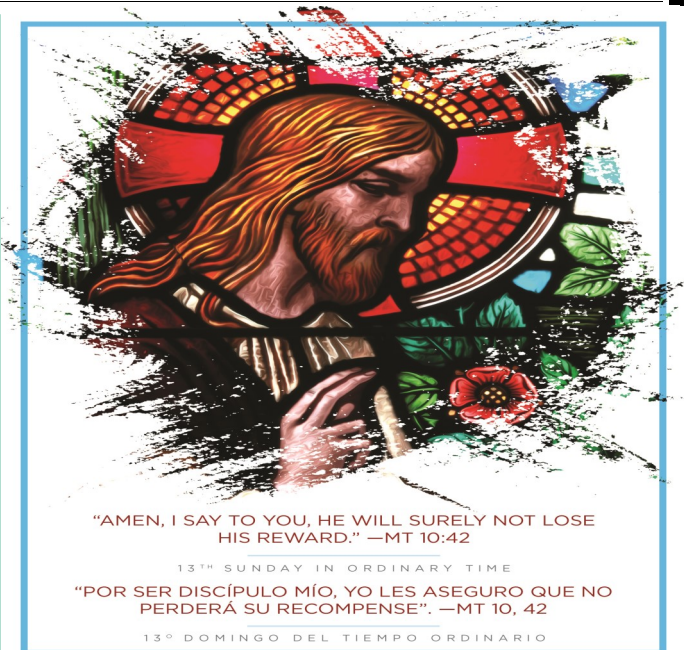




Cathedral of the Sacred Heart

Our Sunday Visitor Question of the Week. Jesus asks his disciples to take their cross and follow him. **Questions:** What does Jesus demand of his followers? What does this Gospel teach you about the cost of discipleship and how does it relate to your experience so far?

Choose one of the following activities as a way to further reflect on the Sunday readings:
Jesus teaches us that our relationship with him needs to be the most important relationship in our lives. Then everything else will fall into place. Invite family members to share how putting Jesus first can have a positive effect on your family.
Ask everyone to look around the house for something that can serve as a reminder to focus their life on Jesus. Provide time for each person to explain their choice.
Brainstorm as a family to come up with a service project you can work on together. Talk about how serving others shows that Jesus is the focus of your lives.
