They have been clear in their message and dedicated to providing practical supports for us during this pandemic. But what does it mean and how can we become better disciples? It begins with a relationship of trust! Trust in the One whose love called us into being. Trust in the One who ‘emptied himself’ of his divinity to show us what human love and fidelity to the will of the Father can look like. Trust that He understands our weakness; meets our brokenness with healing and our sinfulness with mercy. Trust in the promise that God is with us – through all of life’s experiences - to lead us through darkness to light. Trust in the indwelling Spirit sent to empower us, created in the image of God, to grow in the likeness of Christ, whose name we carry. We find the consolation in the Holy Spirit embodied in the compassion of a friend, in our spiritual and actual Communion and our prayers of adoration in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament and then offer the ministry of our presence to those who are lonely, fearful, or grieving. We find the courage to admit our failings and the grace to forgive as we have been forgiven. Witnesses to the power of the resurrection, we live in hope that sacrifice, suffering, loss and death are not the final word. We know that whatever cross we are asked to carry during these days, we do not carry it alone and that new life here and in the hereafter awaits us. This ancient prayer is Scripture based – comprised of psalms, canticles, readings, and prayers for the Church and world.
