What a third grader and listening with the ear of my heart helped this 'church lady' understand on a much deeper level. My first real job as a Director of Religious Education was at a parish in Minnesota. For a rookie straight out of St. John's School of Theology it was ideal setting! I was surrounded with experienced mentors and had tons of support! As the “DRE” I had the privilege of ‘supervising’ a Preschool-Primary Coordinator and a part-time Youth Minister who worked directly with youth in grades 7-12. The three of us shared a full time RE secretary. Our pre-K through grade 6 sessions were held after hours in a Catholic school and a lovely home adjacent to the parish served as a youth ministry drop-in center where food, fun and ministry happened regularly! A team of adults and our Pastor helped with adult education. A slice of heaven. I instinctively understood that I could continue to learn much by listening to the wisdom that I was gracefully immersed within.

Reflecting back on these first days of ministry, I see how I had caught some good ol' Benedictine spirituality that led to my flourishing in my first ministerial position. My parents had taught me the value of two Benedictine charisms – prayer and work. My experiences at St. John's began to teach the value of humility and how to ‘listen’ with the ear of my heart...to engage my whole being in ‘learning.’

This is where the third grader comes in! I was sitting in on a third grade session. They were talking about how the church is more than just a building. There was a picture in their book of post war devastation in Dresden, Germany with a caption that read ‘church left standing in bombing raid.’ A little boy boldly spoke up! “Miss Marge, they got it all wrong!! The bombs killed the Church and left the building standing!” He listened with the ear of his heart and taught us much that day! He helped me understand in the marrow of my bones that God loves and counts on the people in the buildings to be church – the Body of Christ – in and out of the structure. That lesson informs my faith to this day.

“I” was able to navigate a huge responsibility because God allowed me to recognize it wasn't about me. Gifts were abundantly flowing through the disciples that were fed regularly at the Table of God's Word and Altar – especially that night – from a third grader!

Please keep living and sharing your relationship with Jesus and your faith in little ways. You may never know who and how you are helping someone grow in faith, hope, and love! You are a part of God's plan!
