Cathedral Survey – some telling and exciting results.

A huge “Thanks” to the parishioners who completed the survey. It was a very small sampling of the parish. Those who accepted the invitation to sign up for Flocknotes – received it. The invitation was issued through the bulletin and faith formation gatherings. This first survey was directed to adults. We had hoped to offer it through the website but ran into technical difficulties.

Forty percent (40%) of those contacted replied. The results indicate that 76% of these respondents are comfortable with gathering in small numbers, social distancing, with masks in the church. Over one-third (38%) have a family member at risk for complication of the virus at home. 79% feel comfortable and equipped for online learning opportunities. That number rises to 93% if the respondents could receive a bit of technical support. (Young and technical savvy church – here is a ministry opportunity. Please call Marge if you can help.) 62% are open to gathered learning opportunities with safety precautions in place.

Coming Soon. Our adult formation facilitators have been looking over resources and are gearing up to renew online and gathered formation sessions. In addition to Digging Deeper two series are being considered; Jesus, The Way, the Truth and the Life and Pillars (a study of the Catholic Catechism). We hope that you will consider joining us for any of these upcoming offerings.

As the only buildings available for use are the Church and office our options for gathered learning are extremely limited. Our faith formation team hopes to find creative ways to minister to families. Your input is needed & valued.

Walk for Peace. Today, Sunday, August 9th, is the Second Sunday of the month. The Pueblo Benedictine community picked 2pm on the Second Sunday as time to engage in a Silent Prayer Walk for Peace. While this walk traditionally happened at the Riverwalk, all are invited to take a walk in your own neighborhood and pray that Christ’s peace be experienced in the homes, schools, businesses, churches, parks, and community centers your pass.

On a mission. Last week, you may have read how parish based activities like *Peanut Butter Angels*, *Trunk or Treat*, *Soup and Stations* drew folks into a community where these individuals could discover and deepen their relationship with Christ. With ‘gathered’ activities in short supply – the place where individuals will first encounter disciples is rightly shifting from being parish centered to being home and neighborhood centered.

Drawing others into a relationship with Christ is the mission of all the Baptized. Your encounters with friends, family members and virtual strangers where you are – is where Jesus will meet them. Through your Baptism you were united to Christ, given a share in His mission and sent out to be His loving Presence in your little corner of this world. This can and does feel overwhelming ..until we remember last week’s Gospel – the multiplication of the loaves and fish. ***We remember that the Good News in that story is our Good News too!*** Our little offering presented to Jesus to be used for His purpose– is blessed and enough! What can these ‘offerings’ look like; a happy meal for a homeless person, a phone call- where you do the listening, a heartfelt note, a tithe of time or treasure, putting the needs of another before ‘my wants,’ a kind word or compliment that lifts someone's spirits, sharing a story of how God ministered to you in your need/fear/grief, a silent prayer walk for peace, praying with and for someone...the list is endless. Trust in Jesus and the ‘little ways’ you are bringing His love into the circumstances you are in. He is counting on you!
