Very little of the structures of our society feel normal or even near normal. Yet the rhythm of our days are faithfully marked by the rising of the sun and its setting. Was it this predictability – this faithfulness that led people for millennia – and across traditions – to attach prayer to these occurrences. Morning and evening prayer are a twice daily touchstone and a reminder to trust that, **God's got this!**

As Christians, each night is a sort of dying or surrender of control – and each morning is a rising to face – with God's help – whatever the day brings. Parents, as you and your children face the unpredictability this new school year brings – take time each day to remember what is true, right, real and everlasting, our life in God. Take time to pray with your children. Nothing fancy. Each morning, just ask Jesus to walk beside you and help you through the tough parts of the day. As the sun sets, take a few minutes to sit with your child. Together, ask the Holy Spirit to fill hearts and minds with memories of the day past. With Jesus still at your side, review the day and celebrate all the ways God has been present to you in joys, sorrows, challenges, and surprises. If you discover – as we often do – that you were not your best self – don't be afraid to humbly look at those those times with Jesus. This is when we need to rely on him the most! Ask him to help you- to give you the Grace to do better tomorrow. Lay your head on the pillow and surrender the days and its event over to our merciful Father and trust. The sun will rise on a new day and the One who's got this – has each of you – has us - in an embrace of love that is eternal!
