Keeping Christ in the Center of our lives. Paradoxically, in this pandemic era this can be *easier and harder than ever!* Easier because our lives have in a sense – come back to us. By necessity, we focused on essentials. Harder – because in large part, all of it – family life, jobs, school, prayer, socialization, entertainment – came back to us under one roof, **our own**. Worrying about the economy can make this even harder, causing us to be stressed about keeping that roof over our heads.

We have seen how these extraordinary pressures can magnify fears, enflame old wounds, open new ones, and deepen divides between neighbors. All of this has a profound impact on the lives of those under our roofs and the health of our bodies.

In a real sense we are experiencing the cross. Like Jesus on the Cross we are unable to hold onto those things that formerly gave us identity, security, and our sense that we can go it alone. Like Jesus, we surrender to weight of our cross and in this holy darkness we await the dawn of a new life. The chaos of these times can become an opportunity for us to see how God remains trustworthy through all of this! Not by making things go our way but by inviting we to say “Yes” like Mary did, welcoming His Son into our lives and our very bodies through reception of Holy Communion.

I, we, come to Mass precisely because we embrace our brokenness and our need for the undeserved mercy, love and healing that Jesus offers us in the gift of the Eucharist. Before we receive the Body and Blood of Christ in Communion, we make the words of the centurion seeking healing for his servant our own and surrender to His authority and God’s plan for us. “O Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, say only the word and my [soul] shall be healed.” We trust in Jesus to be the balm that heals our souls, minds and bodies individually and collectively! Then we can give away what we have received and add to the growing light shining in the darkness.
