OSV Question of the Week. Question for Children: We show our love for Jesus by loving our friends and family. Share one way that you show your love.
Question for Youth: Jesus tells us that we are to love others as we love ourselves. Do you love yourself? Can you see the good that God has put within you? Do you find it easier to love others or yourself?
Question for Adults: Repeat the two commandments which Jesus teaches today in your own words? For each of them, share how it has become part of your life.

OSV Activity of the Week. God asks us to love our neighbor. As a family, investigate the treatment of refugees or other immigrants in your community. What difficulties do they experience? Talk about what you as a family can do to help.

Together with your family, draw a large heart on a blank sheet of white paper. Cut out the heart and write the passage from Matthew's Gospel 22:37-39 inside. Hang the heart in a special place to remind your family of Jesus' Great Commandment each day.
