What does it take to get to know another person?

Deacon Ben posed this interesting question for us during last week's homily. If we saw someone standing in front of the altar in our Church, what could we know about that person? Hair and maybe eye color? skin tone? male/female? neat and clean? messy/dirty? *Maybe* clothing points to an allegiance to a team or cause... all fairly superficial observations. Getting to know that person would take an investment of time, energy, and an openness to discovery. It involves listening to his/her story – origin, hopes, dreams, and struggles and being open to having that person's story change something within me to make room for that person in my life. The more time and investment in that relationship the deeper the bond and commitment. Each Sunday we come to Mass and see our priest/Bishop vested in a stole and chasuble; our deacons in stoles and dalmatics. We see their allegiance to following the Way set before them that flows from their relationship with Jesus the Christ. Even more than that, with the eyes of faith, we encounter Jesus, the Risen Christ in Word and Sacrament, in the ministry of the ordained and the assembly of the Baptised. But how well do each of us know this Jesus we encounter? Is our relationship deep enough to sustain us in these challenging times? Do we make time to sit at His feet daily, listening to Him speak and making room in our hearts and minds for a new way of viewing ourselves and our world? The growing darkness of our days in the northern hemisphere serves as an analogy for the darkness of sin and division in the world and powerfully speaks of our absolute need for and dependence on the Light of Christ to guide and shine through us. Each Advent we remember our individual and corporate need for healing and salvation. The scriptures of the year that will unfold before us are a treasure map leading to a deeper relationship with Christ our King. The new Church year begins on the First Sunday of Advent, November 29 and the Gospel of Mark will be predominant. This year, let us take up the challenge to get to know Jesus better through a prayerful reading of the Gospel of Mark.

OSV Question of the Week.

Children: Who are the people most in need of help who live around you, and how can you help them?

Youth: What can you do (alone, with friends, or with your family) to help those who are without food, shelter, or have other needs? When have you seen Jesus in the poor? **Adults:** As you grapple with this very strong, direct and demanding Gospel passage, name the people for whom you have cared personally – or if there are none, those for whom you will offer care in the coming weeks.
