‘The Baptism of the Lord’ is the last day of the Christmas season. Tomorrow ‘Ordinary time’ begins. Because of our Baptism and our relationship with God through Jesus, we move into ‘ordinary time’ with an increased awareness that a

world Graced by the Incarnation of the Word of God is anything but ‘ordinary!’ It is a world into which we, the Baptised, are sent to make God’s love know to all. Take a few minutes this week to remember Baptisms; your own and those of family members. Consider how these sacramental moments set us on a lifelong path, following the Way modeled for us by Jesus. 

Our Sunday Visitor (OSV) Question of the Week.

Theme: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." These words are also spoken to us... "With you I am well pleased." What are you doing right now that is pleasing to God? How does it feel to live that way?

OSV Activity of the Week. Choose one of the following activities to further reflect on the Sunday readings: 1) Our commitment in baptism is to be a servant of God, spreading the good news of Jesus to others. Discuss one action that you could do as a family this week to spread the good news of Jesus to others.



2) Place holy water in a special dish near the entrance of your home. Encourage family members to bless themselves with the sign of the cross each time they enter or leave the house. Practice

making the sign of the cross as a reminder of our baptism and of our identity as God’s adopted sons and daughters. 3) Discuss these questions: What are we called by our baptism to become? Where do we get the power to do this? How does the Spirit act in our lives?
