Question of the Week...

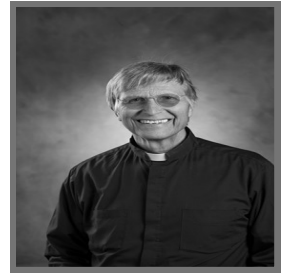
Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Reflection based on the Gospel of Matthew, Chapter 28, versus 16-20. As you hear Jesus sending out his followers, what strikes you about his words and commands? What image of the church, then & now, does this give you? Why do you think Catholics make “The Sign of the Cross”? How often do you think of God as Trinity? How do you relate to each member of the Trinity? What does it mean to you, that through our union with Christ, we are immersed into this Relationship of Love?

Activity of the Week for Young families.

Pray the Sign of the Cross with you family. Use the prayer to bless your children at bedtime. As you pray the words, trace a small cross on your child’s forehead with your thumb.

All households. Make a holy water font or dish for your home to remind yourselves that you come and go each day ‘in the name and Love of the Trinity.’

Not long after Pope Francis was elected pope, he published his signature letter for the Church The Joy of the Gospel. He asked us to pray for him that his time as pope be filled with that joy of Jesus Christ, the good news of Jesus’ gift of freedom for all peoples.

Dioceses and parishes of the world jumped on his words. They struck a chord in the hearts of many people. In our diocese, Bishop Isern and Bishop Berg followed up with the letter by appropriate workshops. We listened to Sherry Weddell as she called us to be “intentional disciples,” who were willing to follow Jesus in the parish life, and help others to do the same.

Bishop Berg and members of his staff then made a retreat in Florida with a large number of US bishops and staffs in a program for the Convocation of Catholic Leaders; The Joy of the Gospel in America. When bishop and his staff came back, they decided to follow up with the results of surveys taken by Bishop Isern, findings that shed a light on the needs of the diocese: youth, finances, morale, communications.

Deacon Dan then began to spread the word regarding that convocation through a program called “The Four Levels of Happiness.” The premise of these workshops presented the hope that we can move from happiness that is the result of “getting something” such as pleasure from food, drink, sex, power, ego strength (Levels I and II) to happiness that is the result of giving to others and God through the very goodness of our hearts and the realization that we are doing so as a result of God’s grace. (Levels III and IV).

Following those workshops, we were called by the bishop to a diocesan convocation May 7-10 here in Pueblo. Each pastor was asked to form a parish leadership team which would help him in the daily duties of leading the parish. This team was not set up to usurp the necessary functions of the Parish Council and the Finance Council and parish committees, but to help the pastor in the day to day “stuff” of the maintenance of the parish.

The Parish Leadership Team/ Amazing Parish Team (the PLT/APT, as it is alphabetized), is small, seven members, 5 staff and 2 members, one from Parish Council and one, a recent member of Finance Council, meets weekly to check with the pastor to help him stay in touch with staff, councils and committees; Councils and Committees meet monthly to keep track of the broader picture of parish activities, such as budget, DMF, security issues, the upkeep of the church, liturgy, etc., all of us working together to keep that joy of the gospel alive in the Cathedral.

Please pray for our parish; Bishop Berg has mandated us to form this team as part of his strategic plan for the diocese. We’re all in this together. God bless us all. Fr. Jim
