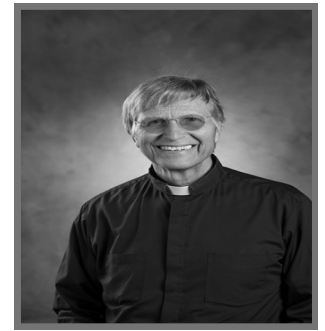

When you read this piece, I'll be in Iowa. It's that time of year again. Just as Pueblo has the Colorado State Fair to enjoy and/or contend with, so the Cedar Valley Engine Club (CVEC) has its annual tractor and steam engine show. This year's show features Oliver and White Tractors, most of which were manufactured in Charles City, Iowa. Unfortunately the Oliver/White plant shut down in the 90's; the result of that action was a major recession in the area. Agriculture alone could not handle the downturn, especially as farm prices and land prices had plummeted in the 80's.

The history of so much of rural Iowa and other Midwestern states is littered with failed tractor plants, feed stores, growth of large corporate farms and the loss of smaller family farms. In 80 years the number of family farms has fallen from 6.2 million to just under 2 million. The same amount of land (about a billion acres) is still being farmed, but in bigger chunks, like about 500 acres on average up from 160 acres. So farming is still happening, but with more and more farmers and farmers' wives taking on a job in town to supplement income. There's also some slow down with the proposed tariffs.

Much of this may sound pessimistic but you wouldn't know it as you attend tractor shows such as the one we are part of. Every Labor Day we open up our dad's grocery store which he closed 50 years ago this month. So many of the items that were used and sold back in the 20's, 30's and 40's are still proudly displayed on the original shelving. When my brother Al started working up plans to reopen the store as a museum piece, he figured that it would be a good idea to move it three miles north to the site of the engine club, where it could be opened as part of the engine club's show along with an old one room country school house, a number of barns housing machinery and tools of past eras, antique centers, and flea market tents. After the family dickered with the electrical companies who had to help lift high line wires so that the building could pass safely under them, and after working with a great large building moving company, the move was finally accomplished in April of 2008. When the building was placed on a new foundation and electricity was hooked up, we found that all the lights still worked and all the plugs were still hot. The only problem was dealing with groundhogs and badgers who had decided to set up homemaking in the old basement. Fortunately they did not put up too much of a fight. The store has now been at the new site for 10 years, and looks pretty darn good for a 114 year old former DX gas station, Clover Farm grocery store, Larro Feeds, and Osh B'Gosh bib overalls sales.

In spite of the difficult times in farming and economy, these words of today's reading from the letter of James still hold true: "All good giving and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no alteration or shadow caused by change."
