The year was 1949. The war (WWII) had been over for 5 years. If there was such a thing as normal, life was beginning to get back to normal in spite of the Berlin blockade and the threats to Korea from China.

Dad and Ma and the seven kids were living in an old farmhouse that was situated on a farm ½ mile south of Roseville and our store. The house was pretty dilapidated, no electricity, no running water, an upstairs filled with honey bees and a downstairs that tilted to the southwest. If any water got spilled on the floor, it took a natural path right out the corner of the house. Who needed running water? And with \$5 a month for rent, how could you go wrong? Especially since there were acres and acres in which to play!

Be that as it may, dad and ma were looking for something different. A small farm house across the highway from the store came up for sale after the death of the owners. It had electricity and running water. It was handy for dad to go back and forth to the store; it was situated on 3 acres of land and was right across from the church and 2 room country Catholic school.

There was a problem. The owners had not made a will. Everything was in the hands of the probate lawyers. Not only were dad and ma interested in the house; so were a number of relatives, farmers looking for additional land to add on to theirs, and perhaps a shyster or two.

Dad wanted me to go with him and ma. For some reason I sat on the opposite side of the courtroom from my parents with my grandmother who was there praying her rosary like a madwoman. As time went by and arguments were bantered back and forth, I found myself getting disinterested, mostly because I was seven and I didn’t understand what was being palavered. Finally, apparently, the judge had heard enough. With a loud bang of the gavel, he said: “I’ve heard enough. The house goes to Mr. and Mrs. Koenigsfeld for \$4900. Discussion closed.”

Well, my mother burst into tears and cried and cried, she was so glad; dad was never one to show much emotion, but a wisp of a smile passed his lips, and I knew he was glad too. While I was too young to understand anything about social status, I knew that we were considered “poor,” and some of the folks who were hoping to get that place for their own reasons might be considered “rich.” Yet somehow, the “poor” were able to achieve some success.

In the second reading James says: “Show no partiality as you adhere to the faith in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ. For if a man with gold rings and fine clothes comes into your assembly, and a poor person in shabby clothes also comes in, and you pay attention to the one wearing the fine clothes....while you [pay little attention to the poor person], have you not made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil designs?” (James 2:1-3)
