Faith Formation sessions are happening here at the Cathedral nearly every day of the week.

Gr. K-5 meet from 6:15-7:30 pm on Tuesday evenings. Parents, please remember to come into the Church, sign your children in and remain for prayer and announcements.

Gr. 6-8 meet on Wednesday evenings, 6:15-7:30pm in the classroom off the gym. Parents please come in to the building to sign your youth in and out of class.

High School Youth gather Sunday, October 14, 1:30-3:30pm in the Cafeteria Conference Room. They will attend Rosary Sunday.

Adults gather for a variety of options: Digging Deeper (Lectionary based Bible Study) on Sundays from 9-10 am (Cafeteria Conference Room) and Tuesday evening, 6:30-7:30 in the Parish Office.

Survey of the New Testament Bible Study: Wednesday evenings, 6:30-7:30pm in the Parish Office. Read St. Paul's letter to the Romans & come with your thoughts & questions.

The Light Within, our contemplative prayer group, meets on Wednesday afternoons from 1-2:30pm in the Parish Office. The group is reading & discussing "A Taste of Silence." Each session concludes with 20 min. of contemplative prayer.

The women's spirituality group, "Catholic Women of Conscience" now meets on Friday morning from 9:30-11:00am in the Parish Office. The group is reading, "*A Season of Mystery: 10 Spiritual Practices for a Happier Second Half of Life.*"

Children's Liturgy of the Word will be offered for children between the ages of 5 and 10 during the 10:15am and 12 Noon Sunday Masses. After the Opening Prayer of Mass, the Deacon or Father will invite children forward and the community will send them to the room off the altar where a catechist will help them understand how the Sunday Scriptures apply to them. The children return to their parents during the collection.

Second Sunday, Second Meal. On October 14 we will be sharing the gym with Rosary Sunday participants. This means that we will only be able to work in the gym from 8:30 - 10:30am then clean and set up for their reception. We can do this! I just returned from our 50th ordination class reunion in Ohio. We began our time in Sandusky, OH with a good old fashioned clam bake and trimmings. For many of us, especially those of us from the West, we had to be taught how to eat the critters. All that we were accustomed to were Rocky Mountain oysters. Quite different. We traveled to downtown Sandusky on Monday, and visited some very different kind of places. One such venue was the merry go round museum featuring a workshop on carving the horses that are often represented on the rides (although many different animals, even insects are used for the smaller children.) We even got a ride on a real carousel. For many of us old codgers, the circular motion was too much for our linear brains. We staggered off the ride (a merry go round, for crying out loud!!) as though we were dipping in the sauce.

We visited another museum, the Lake Erie Maritime Museum. Since we live so far away from any really big body of water, it was interesting to see how water dwellers live, especially with the harvesting of ice during the winter. We celebrated Mass at Holy Angels Church in Sandusky. That was truly a very powerful experience for us all.

Tuesday was our trip to the big city of Cleveland where we visited the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame (loud and boisterous), a chance to visit the USS Cod, a docked submarine, the Cleveland Botanical Gardens and Art Museum and the Science Museum. Even though people often make fun of Cleveland as a rather grimy city, it's anything but bland. Interspersed amid all of this were trips to restaurants, trips that caused many of us to add too much to the already existing spare tires that surrounded us.

Wednesday was a wonderful day for scenery and education. We traveled to the Ohio Amish Country of Charm and Millersburg. Horses and buggies were lined up along the main drag in Charm which was only 2 blocks long. It was auction day which caused a horse and buggy gridlock scene somewhat like our interstates at rush hour, but with no beeping of horns or sounds of impatient people. Once in a while a horse would whinny which would set off a cacophony of an entire riata of horses' comments about the number of tourists in town.

Then we visited the Amish Mennonite museum; there were some interesting comments made about the Catholic Church and its connection with the Anabaptists who fled the Old Country; but the presenter was honest in saying that the Reformers were just as hard on the Mennonites as were the Catholics.

From there we visited an Amish farm, saw how the Amish lived at least in the last century, rode in one of the buggies around the farm, and studied what the kids studied in the Amish one room schoolroom. All in all it was a great deal of fun and Q & A with a very patient guide. The Amish have a very close knit style of life, but also have their difficulties with retention of the children and division among the many Amish and Mennonite sects.

Thursday we traveled to the Josephinum for our celebration Mass and dinner. We were treated like royalty with wonderful meals, tours and memories. I was asked to be the main celebrant for the Mass and the preacher of the word. I remembered all of you at Mass and also prayed for our four classmates who have died. Being back at the seminary was a lot like being back home, since many of us had spent 12 years at the school.
