## FROM THE RECTOR

There's something about kids that just can't be ignored. On our recent parish/diocesan trip to Fatima, Lourdes, and Marian sites, there was one thing that kept coming up, especially at Fatima in Portugal and Lourdes in France. Mary is said to have appeared to tweens and teens between the ages of 8-14. These young girls and boy, 2 girls and one boy in Fatima, 1 girl in Lourdes, seem to be so honest. The photos of the children show honest faces of real children. In both cases, the children were watching sheep or taking care of other chores. They seem to be such down to earth kids who wouldn't have any reason to lie or make up a story so outlandish that their families, their communities and really the whole world would just laugh them to shame. Who in their right mind would believe that Mary would appear to people that nobody knows or cares about who would believe that such an event could even occur?

In Fatima, the three children, Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco, simply stand for their pictures without any pretenses. The youngest girl, Jacinta, stands with one hand on her hip just daring anybody to doubt her word. She looks as though she's ready for a fight. The other two are more reserved in their attitude. All three had a difficult time because of their persistence in holding to the account of what they saw. In fact, the three children were thrown into jail for three days in an attempt to get them to admit that they were lying.

In Lourdes, Bernadette looks very serene and composed in all of the photos. She was a very poor child who spoke a form of French that was very colloquial, a form of patois. When she first saw the appearance, she called Mary, "that "white thing." "Did you see that white thing over there?" she said to her cousins who were with her. And then when her local parish pastor told her that before he would build a chapel for this lady that Bernadette said she saw he would have to know the lady's name, Bernadette came back with the name the "Immaculate Conception." The pastor asked Bernadette if she knew what that name meant; she admitted that she didn't have the faintest idea. But she didn't care. She simply said: "Look, I've done my part, I got you the name. Now you have to do your part. She says, 'build me a chapel.'" That's when the pastor decided he had better get to it.

As you know, Catholics do not have to believe that these events occurred. They are considered private revelations and are not imposed on people as something they have to believe in. Lourdes, Fatima, La Salette, Knock are all sites that are approved by the church as places where there's good reason to believe that Mary has appeared. No matter what we think or believe about these events, there's something about those kids that seems to say: they look and they've acted too honestly to be pulling one over on us.

I guess the one thing I came away with was this, pray like crazy: our world needs it badly. God bless us all.
