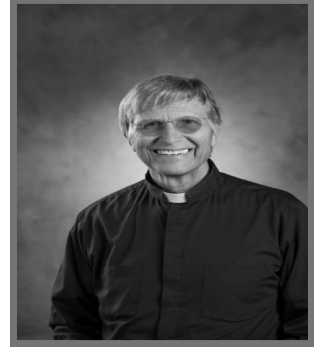
### **Questions of the Week based on today's Gospel**

### **Prayer for the Week:**

Thank you God, for the wonderous gift of our eyesight – and our other senses – through which we experience the world around us! And thank you God, for the gifts of insight and hindsight. In your goodness, you do not leave us stumbling around in the dark. You send your Son to accompany us through the shadows of our lives to New Life. May you open our eyes to recognize your hand and your Grace guiding us through the encouragement and care of others.

Your prayers, voice and hands are needed to help lift up the homeless and hungry in Pueblo. No formal community action has been agreed upon by civic leaders to provide a warming shelter and second meal to those living in poverty or on the streets. Please talk to your neighbors and friends and encourage them to speak to city, county and church leadership on behalf of those in need. And let us join together in the parish hall on the Second Sunday in November 11 to put together another 500 sack lunches for distribution by Peanut Butter Angels.



Two weeks ago I promised that I would tell you what really happened on the pilgrimage to Fatima, Lourdes, Montserrat and other places in between. Actually there isn't anything shocking or extra thrilling.

Number 1: we were able to bring back 100% of all the people with whom we began. That was a pretty good percentage since we had 44 people on the trip.

Number 2: everybody seemed to have had a deeply spiritual time as well as a good time.

Number 3: our guide (Teresa, we called her Mother Teresa), and our driver, Viktor, were the best guide and driver that one could ask for.

Number 4: Mother Mary watched over us the whole time: only one serious accident (broken arm) and two less serious (skinned knees and turned ankle.)

Number 5: everyone who went into the baths at Lourdes came out with some sense of spiritual guidance. (You must ask Freddie about his experience.)

Number 6: the Pyrenees were covered with SNOW! And we heard through the internet that Wolf Creek and Monarch were getting SNOW!

Number 7: even though we didn't do the Camino, we were able to receive the coveted sea shell for our entire group and a certificate that we had arrived safely at the final stop of the Camino in Santiago, Spain.

Number 8: we watched the famous charcoal censer in the church of St. James in Santiago swing back and forth from one end of the two transepts of the famous cathedral. It was quite the event! 8 men had to pull with complete coordination on a rope and pulley system to keep the censer on a straight and narrow path.

Number 9: we celebrated Mass in some of the most beautiful places one could imagine; a special one? In the church near the cave of Mary's appearance at Covadonga, Spain.

Number 10: history, history, history and Mary's role in it throughout all of Portugal, Spain and France. I had no idea that there were so many connections with Mary. Of course, Fatima and Lourdes... but the others.....no idea!

Thank you for your prayers for our safety. We remembered you too at all the places we visited. God bless us all.
