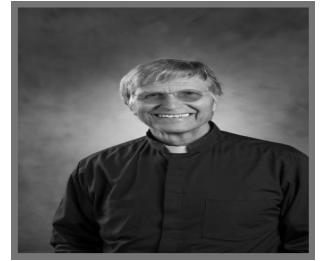

We've already celebrated a number of feasts in November, All Saints Day, All Souls Day, and now Veterans Day on this 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. Admittedly Veteran's Day is not a feast day in the church calendar, but certainly what we celebrate on Veteran's Day fits into the gospel for this Sunday. Jesus praises the poor lady who puts all of her resource into the temple poor box. "...she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood."

For those who gave their lives in defense of country the words of Jesus are very appropriate. Out of their poverty, they gave everything they had, not only their livelihood, but their entire lives. A person can't do much more than that.

But Jesus' words apply also to those veterans who didn't lose their lives, but gave their all in their desire to keep country and family safe. In our parish we have many vets who gave so much of their lives for country and family. I don't know whether there are any veterans of WWII age, except for one of our parishioners who fought in the Battle of the Bulge on Christmas Day of 1944. I know that he wouldn't want me to use his name here, but I know that we are all proud of him even if we don't know his name.

Parishioners were in the Korean conflict (we just recently lost one of our parishioners who was a Marine in Korea during the war there), parishioners were in Vietnam, parishioners were in Desert Storm and in subsequent activities in the Middle East. I know we are all proud of them and what they have done for country and family.

As we remember them, we also remember the very purpose that they were called into service, and that purpose was to establish peace. Peace is hopefully the outcome of any conflict. Unfortunately, as we know, peace often becomes a vague hope in the hearts of people, especially when some action drags on and on for years with no end in sight.

That's where we come in. Not only do we thank our veterans for giving their all in what they have done for us, but we also join in giving our all with our prayer for peace in the world. We also pray and extend our good wishes for veterans' happiness and in many cases their continuing growth in health. So many young men and women have come back from Iraq and the Middle East with PTSD and other problems that we have no idea what they must be suffering. They truly do need our prayers and our support.

Jesus knew what that poor lady was going through in giving her gift. Jesus knows what our veterans have gone through and are going through in their gift of life.
