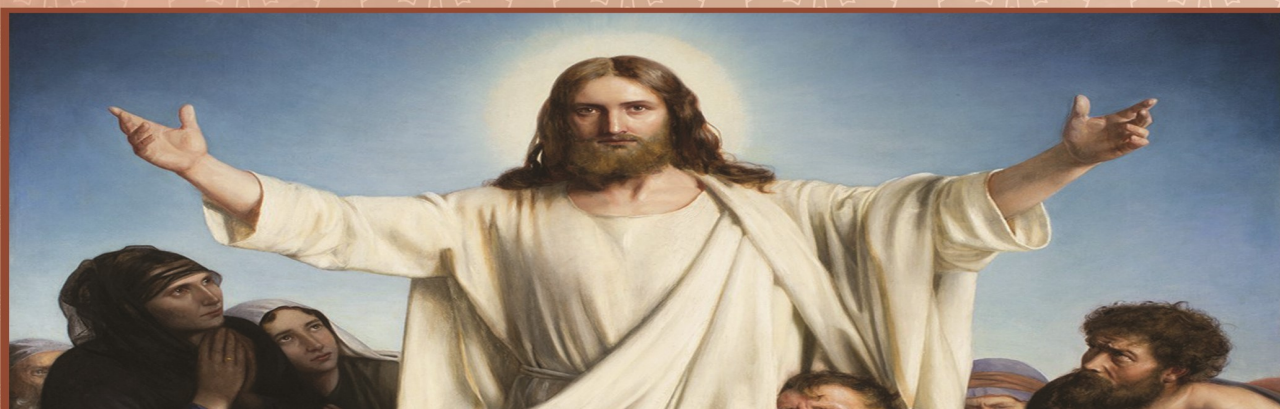

A Reflection from Msgr. Jim

Good morning, good afternoon everyone. I'm sure that you have been very watchful as you saw everything regarding the elections of Nov. 6; now I suspect we are just as watchful to see whether the things that were promised turn into action.

Watchfulness seems to be the hallmark of the follower/disciple of Jesus. In today's gospel there is a sense of watchfulness connected with fear. “Watch out!! The end of the world is coming!!” Or as it was told to us in the old nursery rhymes: “The sky is falling, the sky is falling.” Jesus is definitely telling us to be ready and waiting for the time of the end. But there's something else involved here as well. Notice what he says later on: Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

What were his words: love one another as I have loved you. So watchfulness applies not only our looking for the end times and its signs, but also looking for those moments when our love for one another needs to be shown. Let's substitute the word “attentiveness” for watchfulness; that might help in recognizing what we can do right now for watchfulness.

Those of you who are helping make the sandwiches on our second Sunday of the month are being attentive. Those of you donating coats to the homeless and helping out at the soup kitchen, you are being attentive. Those of you donating to Tom and Louie cupboard for the Thanksgiving baskets are being attentive. All of the high school youth throughout Pueblo and Pueblo West, preparing these baskets and delivering them are being attentive. (Special kudos to a young lady from the parish who is spearheading this effort!!)

It doesn't even have to be attentiveness toward the community. If we simply apply this concept to our vocations we can see Jesus' command working itself out in very ordinary ways. Teachers are attentive to the learning and the struggles of their students. Nurses and doctors are attentive to the needs of their patients. Farmers are attentive to their land. Husbands and wives are attentive to each other's needs.

I remember how dad used to be attentive to mom when she would ask him to “do a Toni” for her. That process of home hair permanent had quite an interesting smell that permeated the house, and caused dad to take up most of an afternoon with close attention while mom made sure that the curlers were just the right size and that they were curled tight enough but not too tight. How often we would hear her yell: “You're making that curler too tight.” And dad would say, “Well, dang it, the last one you said was too loose.” And so the day would go, until the perm was combed out and mom looked pretty good. But dad was so attentive, even though I have a feeling he was chomping at the bit to be about doing something else. But when you don't have the money to go to the beauty shop, you have to do the next best thing. That's being attentive.

Perhaps there's someone or something that needs our attention today. Attending to it will be our watchfulness for the Lord. God bless us all.
