Our Sunday Visitor Question & Activity of the Week

-(Based on the Second reading from St. Paul.)

Theme: Jesus' words and love are for everyone!

Question for Children: What ways do you show God's love to someone who is lonely or hurting?

Traditionally February is the month of love with Valentine's Day plopped right in the middle. The epistle for Feb. 3 is Paul's classic description of love. (1 Cor. 13:4-13). During February I will highlight several of Paul's definitions of love each week. Pick which one is especially fitting for your own beloved. "Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, it is not pompous..." (1 Cor. 13:4) Which of these qualities is your beloved strongest in? **Parenting Pointers** "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you." (Jeremiah 1:4) Even before your child was born you had hopes for him or her. Even before you conceived, you had hopes. Even if you adopted your child, you wondered how this person would grow and change you.
