Children’s Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) will be offered at the 8:30 am and 11:30 am Masses beginning the 1st Sunday of Lent, March 10th. After the Opening Prayer of Mass, children are invited to gather in the South Sacristy with a catechist who will help the children better understand the Sunday Scriptures. The children rejoin their parents in the larger assembly for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. This program is directed to children ages 5-9 years of age to help them participate more fully into the celebration of the Mass.

The Rite of Election will be celebrated today, March 10 at 2:00 and 4:00pm here at the Cathedral. Bishop Berg will recognize men, women, and children over the age of 7 as those “elected” by God as chosen to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation this Easter Vigil. It is with great joy that the Cathedral will be sending one youth to the Rite of Election, Lawrence Sandoval. He has been faithfully preparing for his Initiation for 2 years. The last weeks of his preparation for Initiation coincide with Lent.

OSV Question of the Week. Lent is time to open our hearts more fully to Jesus.

Question for Youth: What is one thing you will do during Lent to become more open to God in your life?
