We tend to minimize the gifts we have been given; our abilities as well as financial and material ‘possessions,’ even viewing them as something we have earned. And, we imagine it is not enough. We envy those at the top. **Not today!** Today, let us stand up and lay grateful claim to the unique gifts we have been given by the ‘One who Gives All’.
