Theme for Harcourt's Question and Activity of the Week: The Theme for Harcourt's Question and Activity of the Week.' "Go and do the same!"

Children: Jesus tells us to love today. Name a time when you showed your love for your family or friends during the past week or two. **Youth:** The Samaritan reached out to a stranger and helped him. Who are the strangers who you could reach out and help in the coming week or month? How will you respond?

Adults: Jesus tells us today to love God, our neighbor and our self. How will you love God this week? How will you love your neighbor this week? How will you love yourself this week?

Marriage Moment. It's July. It's probably hot (unless you live in the far southern hemisphere). How do you and your beloved cool off - an iced drink? a swim? find a place with air-conditioning? Think of a way to help someone who doesn't have AC cool off on a hot day?

As the alternate lyrics for "Let there be Peace on Earth" say "With God our Creator, we are family, let us walk with each other in perfect harmony. May this active prayer inspire other walkers to walk in peace as well.

The Light Within The group will meet on July 11, from 10-11am. The hour will include a 20-minute contemplative sit.

Digging Deeper - A discussion of the Sunday Scripture and the related catechetical concepts each Sunday, 9:45-11:15am. Watch for signs indicating the location.

Adult Formation Opportunities:

Later, when you reflect back on your Sunday, where will you have found God and true happiness? What material gifts from God cause gratitude to well up within you? What did you do or accomplish that led you to feel good about yourself? Did you cooperate with anyone to make a positive difference in your world that left you with a deeper sense of happiness? How have you sought the highest Good today, that is Communion with God? Making this mini reflection a regular spiritual practice can help you grow in holiness as well as experience a deeper sense of true happiness. This mini reflection, based on the 4 Levels of Happiness, is similar to another discipline called the Ignatian Examen. Watch for a bit about this practice next week.

(This summer, the start time will be an introductory insight from the 4 Levels of Happiness. The "Magis Center" maps out 4 levels of human happiness. Each level is related to a facet of our human nature: 1) physical happiness, 2) our ego, 3) our contributions, and 4) our God-given capacity to recognize and seek the ultimate Good, i.e. God. All 4 levels of happiness can be understood as having a good and bad side and all 4 levels can be experienced simultaneously. An extreme and highly improbable example from the positive side of relishing all 4 levels of happiness— you are savoring a cold adult beverage on a hot day after accepting the Nobel Peace Prize and giving away the million-dollar cash award to charity. Your heart swells with gratitude to God for your 'gifts' that have allowed you (acting "In the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit) to make such a positive difference in the world. This would be an example of living at the 4th – Transcendent level of happiness. Don't we wish we were all there and could sustain that balanced way of being in the world. THE GOOD NEWS IS WE CAN! Applying insights from the "Little Way of St. Therese, consider the following.... Its's next Sunday afternoon. (Second Sunday) You are enjoying a cold adult beverage or two, barbecuing with family and neighbors. You are happily thinking back over your morning; remembering the hour you spent making PBJ for Pueblo's hungry and homeless and an hour giving right "thanks and praise" to the God who makes ALL things possible. Not a bad way to spend a Sunday!!
