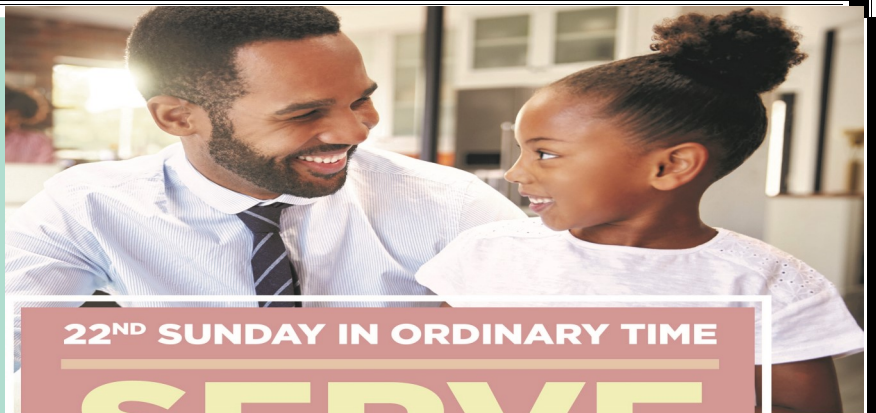




Cathedral of the Sacred Heart

This Weeks Marriage Moment and Parenting

Pointer by Susan Vogt. Many marital arguments focus on "Who is right." It's natural to want to be right in an argument but it doesn't serve your love. Even if you can fact check your position and prove you are right, it's better to come up with a "win/win" solution. Practice looking for creative alternatives during your next argument.

September 8 is Grandparents Day. Most grandparents would appreciate a call, visit, or homemade expression of affection more than a store bought gift. This could be an occasion to link up with history. Ask a grandparent to tell stories, maybe even slightly embarrassing stories of how you were raised.

A second look at last week's second reading. The Letter to the Hebrews Ch: 12 says that we should "Strengthen our drooping hands and weak knees." What happened to athletes who don't exercise? Can you become spiritually "flabby"? Do you ever "work out" spiritually on your own? How? What does St. Paul say will come of this "discipline"? – from St. Louis Center for Liturgy.

This week's first reading from Sirach- written in the second century encourages us to conduct our affairs with humility. In the Sixth century St. Benedict of Nursia, treated the practice of humility extensively in his Rule for living in community. In a wonderful article on 'the value and gift of humility,' Sisters Mary, Marilyn and Rose share insights on the relationship between healthy communities and humility. Sr. Mary noted that St. Benedict 'felt so strongly about the need for humility in community that he dedicated more space to it in his rule than to any other element except for prayer. Humility forms our foundation with God,' Sr. Marilyn continues. "And we serve God through other people. Humility helps us build and maintain strong relationships with each other.
