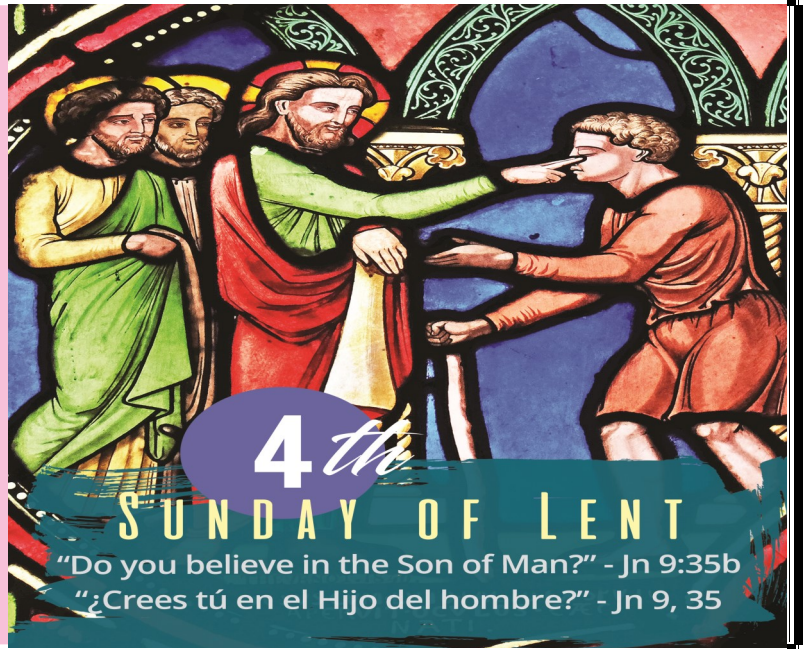

Theme: We are children of the Light.

Breaking Open the Word

Suggested text for faith sharing: Today's 2nd Reading, from Paul

Step One: Listen to the Word

As you listen to this reading proclaimed again just now, how did it touch your heart? What did you hear? What word caught your ear?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question 1: What are the things that Jesus wants you to do as his friend? **2:** Jesus helped a blind man see—and he helps each of us see the world differently. How do you see differently because you believe?

Question 3: Share how you, as a child of the light, in the power of Christ, produce goodness, justice, & truth for the world. What specific actions do you take to do this?

Practice the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy being careful to employ all precautions outlined by health officials. E.g. Avoid personal contact with those folks at greater risk and those who care for them. Reach out by phone to friends, family and those who may be experiencing isolation with a conversation or offer a prayer if you feel comfortable. Let CSH staff know if someone is in need of pastoral care such as Sacramental anointing, food, medication delivery, or any other needs. We will respond as able and refer concerns beyond our abilities to respond to the appropriate persons.

Do I hear bells? We will be ringing the Cathedral Bells at Noon as a reminder and call to prayer. Join in praying the Angelus from wherever you are at 12N when you hear the bells or/and on your own at 6am and 6pm.

May this prayer remind us that through Jesus, God is with us and we are not alone. Below you will find the Angelus so please take a few minutes to join us in prayer.
