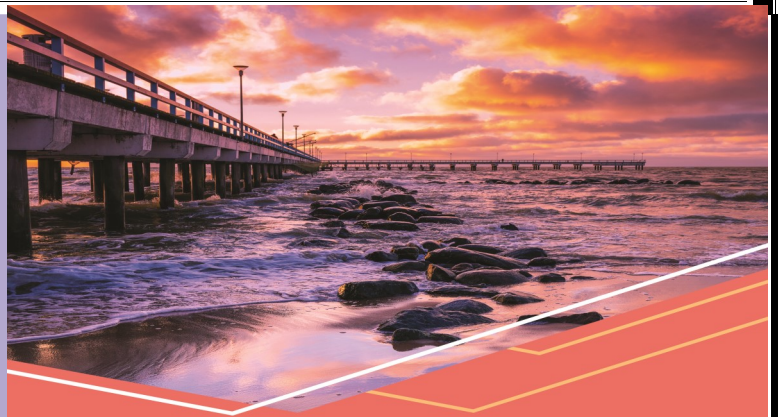


Cathedral of the Sacred Heart

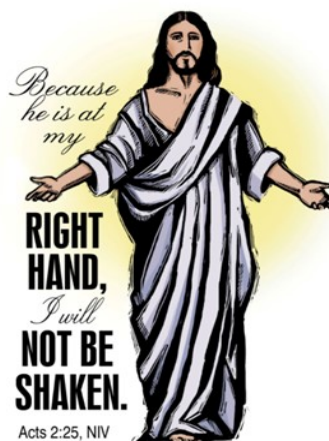

Faith Formation Update.

Disciples of all ages, please consider the following options as possible ways to grow, live & share your faith!

Continue with the Lenten Basics. Pray. Focus on developing a good routine: Morning, Noon, and Night; Mealtime; talking to God the Father, Jesus, the Holy Spirit throughout the day. Participate in our Interactive prayer activity. **Fast.** If you are experiencing any shortages – ask God to help you grow from this trial and consider it part of your Lenten challenge. **Charitable good works.** Share what you have with others. (Call a shelter or agency that offer assistance to others and donate.) Reach out. Check in regularly with family, friends, and neighbors by phone. Smile at strangers ... from a distance of course.

Return to the “My Church Tour” Handbook given out when you began faith formation this fall. Use it for ideas. She will add it as a file at the bottom of the Faith Formation page. If you need a printed copy text Marge.

Called to be Light. Last week Bishop Berg called us to be the Light of Christ for others. Consider turning your outside lights on for a short period each night as a symbol of your family's commitment to try let the Light of Christ shine through each member. Don't worry about being perfect! Strive to be humble and faithful as your home becomes a brighter beacon of Light in the darkness. Watch Bishop Berg's inspirational homily from the Fourth Sunday of Lent. It is now posted on the Pueblo Diocese Website with high quality sound.

Keep Sunday holy as a priority for your household.

Watch Mass together and make a Spiritual Communion. Mass will be livestreamed at 11:30 on Sunday mornings on YouTube and Facebook. Again these can be accessed through the Diocesan website. (You don't need to join Facebook – just decline to join)

Families with young children, especially those preparing for a sacrament go to <https://mlean.smp.org> In the login space Type KidsLiturgy@smp.org and KidsLiturgy123! into the Password space. PLEASE do not change the Password – it is universal for this time. Use the activity as a way to engage your child in the Sunday experience.
