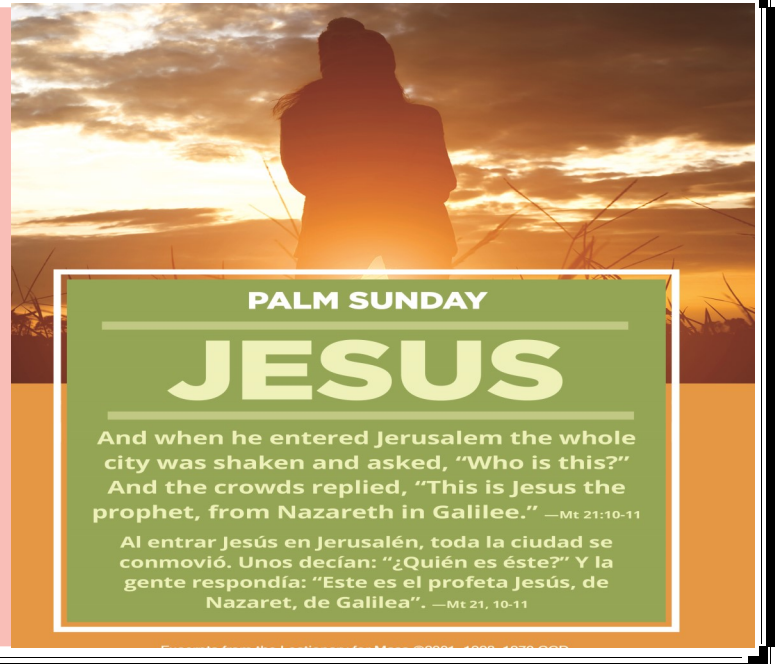

Anointing of the Sick: Call the Parish Office in the event of illness or anticipated hospitalization.

Hospital Visitation: Due to Federal Regulations, our hospitals can no longer supply names or other information about patients. Therefore, patients and family members must notify the parish if pastoral visits are requested. Both Parkview Medical Center and St. Mary Corwin Hospital have priest chaplains and other pastoral staff personnel.

Baptism: Preparation sessions for Parents and Godparents are held four times a year. Please contact the Parish Office concerning preparation sessions and celebration dates for the sacrament of baptism.

Marriage: Engaged couples are invited to call the parish office to make arrangements at least nine months in advance. Persons wishing to have their marriages blessed (validated) should call the office for further details.

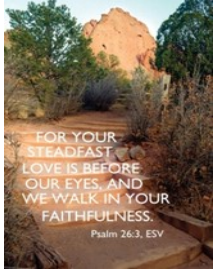

Keeping the Faith: the Church-Home Connection enters a new phase. We are blazing a new trail together. Pope Francis, Bishops throughout the world and our own Bishop Berg have courageously called Catholics to an unprecedented act of sacrifice.

Namely, we are called upon to temporarily refrain from gathering for the Mass and receiving Communion as well as gathering for formation and service. First and foremost, we are asked to embrace viewing livestreamed Masses, spiritual communion, and Adoration from our homes as bridges to an encounter with the Risen Christ. These are tools being used to turn our attention to what truly matters- our dependence on God and our connection to the Father in, with and through Christ our Lord. Our unity does not depend on our physical proximity to each other – it is a function of our life in the Spirit. Access livestreamed Masses through our website www.shcathedral.net. Second, along with public education - faith formation is being done primarily in the home. Materials for K-8 were mailed to homes this week and future pdfs will be available on our website. Passion (Palm) Sunday begins Holy Week. Thursday, Friday and Saturday of this week are called the Triduum – meaning 'three days.' Over the course of these three days the Church celebrates one great creation altering event -the crucifixion, death, and resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ which frees us from

slavery to sin and death! Join Bishop Berg for the liturgies of these days. ***They will be livestream only and not recorded. It will take planning and discipline to participate in this way. It is an unprecedented opportunity to unite with parishes across the city and diocese in one prayer while linking this prayer to acts of faith and devotion in own home.***

Holy Week at home. To prepare: Create a prayer space in your own home using a small table in a room where you can gather together. Be sure to include a crucifix you can use for veneration on Good Friday. (Draw or make one if you don't own one.) You may wish to place a bowl, pitcher and towel in your space on Holy Thursday as a reminder to serve one another. Remember to include a candle as a symbol of Jesus Christ, the Light of the World and a Bible if you have one.

Please also remember those who have been preparing themselves for First Communion. As we all fast from reception of the Eucharist let us be mindful of their hunger.

As we all wait to be fed from the Altar -may we feast at the Table of God's Word. Prepare for the weekend Masses by studying the Sunday Scriptures. If you don't have a Missal at home visit the US Bishops' website <http://www.usccb.org/bible/readings>.

You may also want to visit 'The Sunday Web Site at St. Louis University.' It has great articles and poetry as well as links to the readings.

Families with young children, especially those preparing for a sacrament go to <https://mlean.smp.org> In the login space Type KidsLiturgy@smp.org and KidsLiturgy123! into the Password space. PLEASE do not change the Password – it is universal for this time. Use the activity as a way to engage your child in the Sunday experience.

Meditation: Pray for the grace to walk the passion slowly and reverently, to look beyond the high points and seek out the moments when faith falters, when underlying assumptions are shaken. Listen, too for the times when tiny sparks of uncertainty burst into flames of recognition-”Clearly, this is the Son of God!” - *Daily Reflections for Lent– Not by Bread Alone*– Michelle Franncl-Donnay
