Anointing of the Sick: Call the Parish Office in the event of illness or anticipated hospitalization.

Hospital Visitation: Due to Federal Regulations, our hospitals can no longer supply names or other information about patients. Both Parkview Medical Center and St. Mary Corwin Hospital have priest chaplains and other pastoral staff personnel.

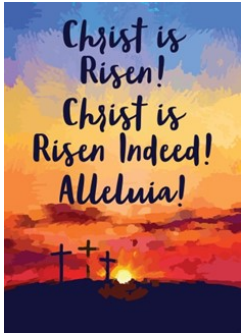

Can there be an Easter without Baptismal waters flowing, heads glistening with Sacred Chrism, jam packed Churches, Easter egg hunts, extended families crowded into homes for traditional meals? These are questions that weigh heavily on many hearts as this Easter Sunday dawns. Some feel weighed down, disappointed, dismayed, even de-

pressed. Our Elect –who journeyed faithfully toward Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist- wait to express their faith. Our young children preparing to receive First Communion –whose most influential preparation is participation in the Sunday Eucharist - are joining in livestreamed Masses from their homes and waiting. Confirmation candidates of all ages wait for news of a date when friends and family can join them in celebrating more fully the outpouring of the Holy Spirit into their hearts. Folks self-isolating, those in quarantine, assisted living facilities, nursing homes and prisons wait for the new life a visit brings. What is a people of faith to do when the circumstances of our lives do not meet with our expectations? We stand with our ancestors and sing Alleluia as a promise; as healing and hope in the face of crisis! We join with a cloud of witnesses who have celebrated Easter under oppressive regimes, in concentration and refugee camps, in wards filled with the dying. We re-member in our own actions those who kept the faith through Depressions, World Wars, plagues and Influenza. These are men and women whose names we recognize; Maximillian Kolbe, Mother Therese of Calcutta, Edith Stein, Oscar Romero and many more whose lives have so brightly reflected the Light of Christ! Their faith has been tested by fire and they emerged on the other side of the trial – continuing their praise and worship of our Lord - here on earth or in heaven. It is our turn to build a legacy of hope! We persevere in faith and we trust the One who sustains us in Love! For we know in the marrow of our born that **OUR GOD LIVES!** Jesus the Christ is **RISEN** from the dead! ***We are an Easter people and ALLELUIA is our song!***

The last weeks of Lent – endured in conjunction with the COVID-19 Pandemic have served for many as a time to strip away so much of what we thought was essential. It has refocused our attention on what truly matters. It has forcefully ‘invited’ us to the Center; to look and reach for God who is always faithfully reaching out to us through Jesus. Grab hold and trust!

As members of the faith formation team we continue to search for ways to connect, to share the Good News, and stories of the ways Jesus is alive and well in these circumstance here and now. Be patient with us and with yourselves. You are doing an amazing job of parenting, working, teaching, praying and persevering in the faith. We are an Easter people and Alleluia is our song.

Ideas:

- Visit www.puebl catholic.org frequently for ideas on how to grow, live and share our faith.
- Decorate your sidewalk and home with Easter words and images.
- Arrange with neighbors through Facebook to have an Easter egg hunt - by making large Easter Eggs and putting them in your window for kids walking by to count. (Thank you for the Teddy Bear Hunt idea.)
- Find and photograph signs of new life and post them to your facebook page with a hopefilled message.
- Continue to reach out by phone to connect with neighbors, especially those living alone.
- Continue practicing social distancing, handwashing and cleaning. We will get through this together and emerge stronger in faith and unity.

Keep Sunday Holy – sit together as a family for livestreamed Masses. Discuss and live the Scriptures. Visit Our Sunday Visitor for the Question and Activity of the week and more.

Holy Week at home. To prepare: Create a prayer space in your own home using a small table in a room where you can gather together. Be sure to include a crucifix you can use for veneration on Good Friday. (Draw or make one if you don’t own one.) You may wish to place a bowl, pitcher and towel in your space on Holy Thursday as a reminder to serve one another. Remember to include a candle as a symbol of Jesus Christ, the Light of the World and a Bible if you have one.
